Proposal type	Details
Minor and machinery in nature	This proposal amends the Work Health and Safety (Codes of Practice) Notice 2022 to give effect to minor and machinery changes to the Concrete pumping Code of Practice 2019 from 1 July 2026. Section 274 of the <i>Work Health and Safety Act 2011</i> requires the Minister to ensure a code of practice is reviewed at least every 5 years. As the previous 5-yearly review, during 2017-2019, was comprehensive in nature, this review was limited to: • technical updates, for example, including relevant information from safety alerts issued by the Queensland Government in the last five years (safety alerts cover key risks and hazards for equipment, workplaces or work situations and are developed in consultation with industry). • editorial changes to improve readability, ensure legislative consistency and update any outdated references. In completing this 5-yearly review, the Office of Industrial Relations: • completed a desktop review focusing on jurisdictional comparisons, development in technology and industry practice, relevant incidents, inquest finding and report recommendations. • undertook a public consultation process between 12 September – Friday 10 October 2025. • updated the code to incorporate stakeholder feedback and relevant new technical information to assist industry in identifying and managing serious risks associated with concrete pumping. • ensured the correction of outdated references to provide legislative consistency and improve readability. This proposal does not result in a change to regulatory policy or impose additional impacts on business, government or the community. The changes do not introduce any new obligations or restrictions or materially

	expand any existing ones. The proposal relates only to corrections, technical errors and minor updates.
