
Proposal type	Details
Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>Contract cleaners in Queensland are entitled to portable long service leave for length of service to the industry, rather than length of service to an individual employer. Under the <i>Contract Cleaning Industry (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 2005</i> (the CCI Act), the employers of eligible workers must pay a levy prescribed under regulation to fund the scheme. As of February 2026, the prescribed levy is 0.75 per cent of ordinary wages. This amendment proposes to reduce the levy from 0.75 per cent to 0.5 per cent.</p> <p>Section 42 of the CCI Act provides that the Contract Cleaning (Portable Long Service Leave) Authority (the CCI Authority) must appoint an actuary to investigate the adequacy of the CCI Authority's funds and the adequacy of the percentage prescribed under a regulation as the rate of the levy, at least every two years. The actuary must state an opinion of whether the levy rate should be reduced, increased or stay the same (s 42(3)(b)). The actuary's report and the recommendation of the CCI Authority in relation to the levy rate must be provided to the Minister (s 42(4)).</p> <p>A full actuarial review of the contract cleaning portable long service leave scheme concluded that as at 30 June 2025, the scheme is in a strong financial position and the levy should be reduced. It is proposed to reduce the long service levy from 0.75 per cent to 0.50 per cent of ordinary wages, effective from 1 July 2026. The proposal relates to an actuarially determined assessment of fee variation and the proposed reduction in levy rate payable is a minor amendment that gives effect to the policy objectives of the CCI Act.</p>

	Given the change is in line with an actuarially determined assessment conducted on 30 June 2025, it is not subject to RIA requirements under the Better Regulation Policy.
